

USGA SLOPE & RATING

A USGA COURSE RATING is the USGA'S evaluation of the playing difficulty of a course for scratch golfers under normal course and weather conditions for the purpose of handicap indexes. It is expressed as strokes taken to one decimal place and is based on yardage and other obstacles to the extent that they affect the scoring of a scratch golfer. A USGA SLOPE RATING evaluates the relative playing difficulty of a courser for players who are not scratch golfers. The lowest USGA Slope Rating is 55 and the highest is 155. A golf course of standard playing difficulty has a USGA Slope rating 113.
